Volunteer Opportunities Beyond the Classroom

Receptionist Services

Adult learners and other guests are greeted and directed by a friendly VIP volunteer at the Sandburg Learning Center.

Vision and Hearing

3,000 elementary students receive these vital services annually through a trained corps of 100 volunteers.

Story Theater (55 years+)

Enthusiastic volunteers perform dramatic readings of children's books as part of a trained ensemble.

Media Center Support

Volunteers help elementary students find books, check books in and out, and shelve books to be ready for eager learners.

Clerical Support

Volunteers provide valuable support to programs by assisting with data entry, mailings, and other light clerical duties.
